

PartIoftheBillcontainsthepreliminarymatters.

These provisions are related to the short title, commencement of the Act and interpretation.

Part II of the Bill outlines a framework for collaboration with stakeholders and other agencies. ThesebodiesincludeCivilSocietyOrganizations,Youth,ReligiousOrganizationsthro ughtheInter- Religious Council of Kenya and persons living with disabilities.
